➤ To all my snack friends: You have never tried a better tortilla chip than Home Made by Sabor Mexicano out of Berkeley, CA. They're thick enough to handle guac but light enough you'll want to polish off the bag in one sitting. They smell and taste like freshly roasted corn. They are not meant for nachos (that'd be like using Dom Pérignon for your office punch), and salsa, your services are not needed—these chips need no embellishments. —ANDREW KNOWLTON
